Dear friends,

The "Merry Month of May" is upon us again. It is that time of year when we begin the transition to summer. The days are getting longer and the sunshine is getting warmer.

The "April showers" are bringing May flowers (and, as Larry Tack reminded us the other day, "if April showers bring May flowers, what do May flowers bring... Pilgrims!).

School years are winding down. Seniors will be graduating from high school and college, looking forward to the summer of transition. Eighth graders are eyeing their freshman year of high school with both eagerness and trepidation. Schools are going on their last field trips of the year.

But in the church, the year isn't winding down, it's just beginning!

Pentecost Sunday this year is May 19. Pentecost is often called the "Birthday of the Church," when the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles "as of tongues of fire," while the sound of a "violent, rushing wind" filled the room. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, Peter and the others began to "speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them the ability." This was the "Feast of Pentecost," or the "Harvest Feast" in the Jewish tradition, so "there were Jews from every nation" in Jerusalem for the feast, and each one heard the Good News of Jesus in their own languages.



And then Peter, the leader of the group, stood up and gave the greatest speech of all time, telling that crowd the story of Jesus and his salvific actions, and here was the true miracle of the first Christian Pentecost: Each of those listening could understand Peter's speech. The Holy Spirit was not just active among the disciples, but everyone in the crowd! Chapter two of Acts ends with the statement that "about three thousand persons were added" that day.

I think that the world is ready for another revival! I ask you to share the story of Jesus with your friends and neighbors. Tell them what Jesus has done for you, and invite them to join you in worship. Pray that the Holy Spirit will convict people and bring them into church, for the first time, or back to church after a long absence.

And I invite you to wear red, orange and yellow to church on May 19, Pentecost Sunday. Let's set the world on fire!
